GOHSEP DIRECTOR KEVIN DAVIS- LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Baton Rouge, LA (August 1, 2013) –As we enter the peak of Hurricane Season, it is worth taking a step back and ensuring that everyone has a "Game Plan" in place should a storm hit.

Although we've made it through two months without any storms, we know all too well the devastating impact just one storm can have. And we're also aware that you just never know when a hurricane might hit.

At the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP), we have been working year-round to ensure that we're ready for whatever Mother Nature throws our way.

As part of our preparations, we have been traveling the state with the Louisiana State Police, the Louisiana National Guard and the Department of Corrections to meet with local law enforcement officials and first responders on the importance of hurricane preparedness.

Just this week, we were in the Lafayette and New Orleans regions to take part in meetings with local officials. In Chalmette, we were joined by Governor Bobby Jindal.

Governor Jindal stressed the importance of having a "Game Plan" in place—not just at the state level, but for folks across Louisiana. The Governor made it clear that if you haven't already prepared for a storm, there's still time. Go out there, get your supplies and get a "Game Plan" so that you and your loved ones can stay safe in the event of a hurricane.
